

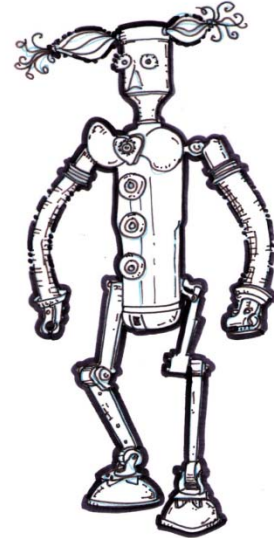

**Notes from the Book Sales Coordinator**

Book sales revenue continues to roll in at a brisk pace. Through the first 24 weeks of 2009 (ending June 18), Friends Bookstore sales totaled \$13,200. 474 books were sold online for \$7,602. The April Big Book Sale earned \$2,575 in the one day event. That's over \$23,300 income so far in 2009! Way to go everyone!

Thanks to all the volunteers work in the bookstore, sort books, set up and work at the sales, create flyers, and help with online sales. We cannot do this business without everyone's efforts.
