# Sherrie Wren celebrated as Best of Friends for 2023

Sherrie Wren was celebrated as Best of Friends for 2023 at Mama Mia's on November 8. In 2019 Sherrie was recommended to be the Friends Treasurer. Since then, she has handled all treasury tasks and produced organized and complete records verified by independent annual financial reviews. She recommended the addition of credit card capability to Bookstore cashiering using the Square platform. She continues to provide ongoing Square training and updates to all cashiers. FMHL credit card sales through October 2023 are \$5,705, a 63% increase over 2022 credit sales. This year, Sherrie got Board approval to purchase two Business CDs which have earned \$2,070 through October. Sherrie also generously donated the furniture for the Bookstore cashiers' corner. 
## 2023 Gift of Reading
