Looking back at last year, Community Librarian Heather Geddes thanked the Friends again for supplementing our Library's budget.

She highlighted these specific areas where Friends made an impact:

- Children's Art and STEM programs
- Puppet Art Theater
- Happy Birds
- Dance and Cultural Programs
- Musical Performances
- Snacks at Teen Programs
- Adult Art and Crafts
- Summer Reading Prize Books

This year, our Library received a special FMHL donation of over \$50,000 for our 50th Anniversary in 2024, including \$5,000 received from donors.

Collaborating with Heather and Chris Ghione with the City, we have installed new patio tables, including an ADA-compliant one. Shade protection and a book-themed bronze bench will arrive by spring.

Board officers returning this year are Joy Safakish (Vice President), Sheila Dunwoodie (Secretary), and Sherrie Wren (Treasurer).

The entire Board values our dedicated members and volunteers, our welcoming Library staff, and our patrons who generously support us. It is a privilege for us to serve our community.

SHOCKED EARTH



A story from the Netherlands about a family in turmoil as they struggle to save their family farm. The setting is the providence of Groningen where gas extraction conducted by international oil companies is an actual historical event.

On their farm, earthquakes have damaged their home, have caused the deaths of livestock and their neighbors are experiencing similar events. Tensions rise between mother, Trijin, and her grown daughter, Femke. Femke envisions a farm based on sustainable growing practices while her mother wants to maintain the traditional ways.

Femke finds some relief in her first romantic relationship that builds her emotional maturity. As the characters gain insight into their plight, the community comes together to voice their dissent. Trijin contributes an energizing morale boost to these efforts while the state-owned gas company seeks to minimize the crisis.

Author Goldschmidt's depiction of the struggle against corporate tyranny with the underlying theme of conventional values versus progressive ideas is a compelling story.





TREASURER'S REPORT

January 21, 2026



FMHL contributed \$27,457 toward our Library's programs, services, and materials in 2025.

Our contributions toward district-wide programs and services benefit us as one of seven community libraries in the SC County Library District.

At the 4th quarter closing on December 31, 2025, the value of our two CDs total \$112,726 and our other cash assets are \$128,759 making our total current assets \$241,635.

Our 2025 Books and Media, and Online income was \$52,156. Our two CDs earned \$2,400 in 2025.

Total donations and grants received are \$15,923. Donations include Crafts sales of \$1,894 thanks to Donna Cotich, our "crafty" member.

In 2024 our total income was \$62,563 and our net after expenses was \$32,224.

Our total 2025 income was \$72,300 and our net after expenses is \$34,771. This is an increase from 2024 of \$2,550.

\$21,000 have been donated by Friends to the SCCLD for spending on the Morgan Hill Library. The additional amount spent on local library programs brings the total to \$27,457.

We also made \$500 donations to both the Santa Clara County Library District (SCCLD) Foundation and the Silicon Valley Reads 2026 "Bridges to Belonging" program which continues through the end of March, including a recent author visit to our library.


We have paid a 50% deposit of \$6,400 on a bronze bench Friends is donating to the MH Library patio. It is being cast at Randolph Rose Collection in New York and should be completed and shipped by March 2026. Three new tables for the patio (one with an accessible opening) and a shade sail are also donated by the Friends.

A recent \$4,000 corporate match donor commented "My family loves this library and everything you all do there!"

We continue to fulfill our goal of supporting our wonderful Morgan Hill Library.




Program HIGHLIGHTS
